2025 ELECTIONS - OPEN BOARD POSITION DUTIES

Vice President

Duties: Shall work with the President and other Board members in the management of the affairs of the Club; chair official meetings of the Club in the absence of the President. May sit as ex officio member of the committees of the Club. Shall oversee the Front Desk operation and provide general guidance to all other Club operations.

Assistant Treasurer

<u>Duties:</u> Shall assist the Treasurer in the duties of the Treasury Office. Will assist in managing the day-to-day accounting and finance requirements. Create, balance, and maintain accurate deposit sheets and coordinate bank deposits. Confidentiality, organizational skills, and accuracy are important qualifications for this position.

Membership Director

Duties: Shall work with the City of Markham on membership promotion, registrations and ensuring membership lists are up to date. Shall monitor and intervene when necessary to confirm program Convenors are adhering to membership policies & procedures. Shall, in conjunction with the City of Markham organize and oversee the annual membership renewal drive.

Director(s) at Large (3)

Duties: Shall fulfill a support and communication role within the Club. Will aid and support their assigned portfolio Convenors in fulfilling their responsibilities. The Director at Large will inform their Convenors of planned closures and other Club events that might impact program schedules. They will serve as a conduit to bring any issues that cannot be resolved at their level to the Board for resolution. The Director at Large will also help to update and develop Club policies and procedures. The successful candidates for these positions ideally possess leadership skills, as well as an ability to problem solve and make sound decisions that encourage positive morale.

NEWSLETTER ANNOUNCEMENT

Your newsletter, O.A.I.A. News and Views, has been available for viewing on our website **markhamseniorcentre.com** for over 10 YEARS.

Throughout that period, we also printed black and white copies and made them available for pickup in the lobby on a first come basis.

Initially, the number of printed copies was large because at the time, only a relatively small number of our members used email and had Internet access. Over time that situation has changed. In fact an email address is now required to obtain a City of Markham registration number needed for club memberships. A recent review of our membership list revealed that only a very small number of members did not provide an email address to the City of Markham. Further analysis found most of those members do in fact have an email address they use within the club however elected for personal reasons not to provide it to the city when registering. That is their right however, by so doing, they will not receive a club closure notification in the event of bad weather or any other broadcast messages the club may send out.

Because the number of our members without Internet access is now very small and in consideration of the environment, the board has elected to stop printing black and white copies of the newsletter three months after this announcement. The May 2025 edition will be the last one printed.

The newsletter will continue to be available on our website.

Members can conveniently view it (**in colour**) from home or on their mobile device. For those members for whom this still poses a problem, they can view it on the club's desktop computer in the lounge. Easy to follow written instructions are available at the lounge computer.


The cost has not yet been determined as it depends on the number of participants. The more participants there are, the fee will be less. I may mention that we now have a new Instructor.




